



# GLMSF Grant Impact 2018

## Medical Scholarship - **\$35,000**

In 2017, GLMSF provided \$35,000 in medical scholarships to seven future physicians. Funds are raised through the Annual Golf Scramble, which is regularly held in September. Recipients in 2017 included University of Louisville students Kevin Connolly, Molly Flottman, Andrea Hiller, Bailey Nelson, Andrew Swierhosz, Taylor Hodge, and Carli Whittington.

GLMSF funded a mentorship program at Coleridge Taylor Elementary. SPAVA placed mentors in grades P-K through 3rd grade who worked for 30-45 minutes for ten weeks. The mentors taught students about respect, integrity and honor, peacemaking, conflict resolution, the need for impulse and anger control, and bullying. Over 650 students were impacted by this program, which helped students better understand that they can be the peacemakers of the world.

## The Healing Place – *Completion of a* **\$25,000 Pledge**

The Healing Place broke ground on the \$29,000,000 expansion in December 2016, with the goal to complete the expansion of services, and to be debt free by December 2018. Nearly \$50 million in capital improvements have been made recently to reach more clients and expand services. Since 2014, GLMSF has provided \$25,000 in funding to support this expansion.

## Medical Mission to Nicaragua - **\$2,300**

GLMSF and Hand in Hand Ministries made its annual mission trip to Managua, Nicaragua in January 2018. For eight years, this trip has improved the health of people and education of physicians in Nicaragua, and in 2018, twelve physicians participated. GLMSF funded a \$2,300 scholarship so a local Pediatric Resident could attend.

## GLMS - **\$18,000**

GLMSF provided \$18,000 in support to GLMS in FY2018. Funding support provided opportunities to support physician membership, promote advocacy, and celebrate leadership. Events funded included the 2017 Presidents Celebration, 2017 Wear the White Coat program, and the 2018 Legislative Reception. Over 300 physicians and community members were involved in GLMS community outreach as a result of funding from GLMSF.

## Surgery on Sunday - **\$2,000**

GLMSF provided a \$2,000 grant to support Dr. Frank Burns in Dancing with the Prospect Stars, which Dr. Burns competed in and won. These funds supported Surgery on Sunday in its IT expansion and development budget, creating sustainable processes that will support the operations of the organization going forward. Surgery on Sunday is a community of people dedicated to ensuring that everyone can receive quality surgical care - regardless of their ability to pay.

## Supplies Over Seas - **\$5,000**

Supplies Over Seas held its second Health & Hope Breakfast on Friday, October 19, 2017 at The Olmsted. The Breakfast increased awareness and support of SOS's important mission of sending local surplus medical supplies and equipment overseas to medically underserved communities in need. The Breakfast was an opportunity for corporate, hospital and medical facility partners as well as generous volunteers, donors and sponsors to come together to celebrate the "health and hope" impact SOS provides both locally and around the world.

## Other Funding Support - **\$2,918**

Additional funding support was provided to support the University of Louisville Awards in Nursing (\$1,500) and the Smoke-town Family Wellness Center (\$1,418) to purchase a defibrillator.
